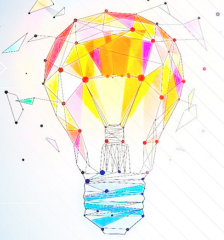

Tire output climbs 3% in 2 months on year

Production of tires in Iran has risen three percent during the first two months of the current Iranian calendar year (March 21-May 21), compared to the same period of time in the past year. Some 40,619 tons of tires have been produced during the two-month period of this year.

In terms of number, a four-percent growth has been also achieved through the production of 3.788 million tires.

As reported, passenger car tires account for the lion's share of the number of produced tires in the mentioned time span, showing a four-percent rise year on year.

Some 4,198 tons of van tires were produced, indicating a 16-percent growth.

Also, 8,494 tons of truck and bus tires were produced, showing a four-percent rise.

Production of the tires of light agricultural vehicles experienced a decline of 34 percent to stand at 2,874 tons, and that of the heavy ones fell three percent to stand at 669 tons.

Meanwhile, 669 tons of road building and industrial vehicle tires were produced, with a 35-percent drop compared to the first two months of the past year.

The bicycle and motorcycle tire output stood at 2,474 tons, indicating 62 percent growth.

In a bid to nullify the U.S. sanctions, Iran is determined to strengthen its domestic production to achieve self-reliance.

Selecting the motto of "Pickup in Production" for the Iranian calendar year 1398 (March 2019-March 2020), and the slogan of "Surge in Production" for the year 1399 (March 2020-March 2021) indicates the Islamic Republic's determination to achieve this goal.

To this end, the Iranian ministries besides the private sector outlined their programs for the surge in production in the past year, and pursued the set objectives seriously in this due.

It is clear that among different ministries, the Ministry of Industry, Mining and Trade was one with a somehow heavier responsibility to materialize the motto of the year.

The ministry managed to fulfill its duty as the production of some major industrial products was noticeably increased in the previous year.

One of the sectors, which achieved outstanding output growth, was the tire production industry. The country's tire industry, despite the continuation of sanctions and the coronavirus pandemic conditions, as well as some domestic restrictions, has had a thriving and successful year overall; a year that was accompanied by record-breaking production and entry into some new fields.

In this regard, breaking of production records in the production of various types of tires was witnessed, and for the first time the annual output surpassed 24 million tires.

In addition to the successes achieved in terms of the output amount, the tire manufacturers entered new areas including production of the wide base tires and the tires of SUVs.

Wide base tires, which are a new generation of the heavy vehicles' tires, were produced for the first time in the West Asia by the Iranian producers. In recent years, with the high investment making of domestic companies and with more emphasis on research and development (R&D), the production of this type of tires with a high-quality standard has been on the agenda, it is while in the past, Iran had to rely on foreign aid to change the generation of tires.

Aluminum ingot output up %33 in 2 months on year

Production of aluminum ingot in Iran rose 33 percent during the first two months of the current Iranian calendar year (March -21 May 21), as compared to the same period of time in the past year.



The country's aluminum ingot output stood at 86,216 tons in the two-month period of the present year, while the figure was 64,689 tons in the same time span of the previous year, data released by the Iranian Mines and Mining Industries Development and Renovation Organization (IMIDRO) showed.

As previously announced by IMIDRO, the production of aluminum ingot in Iran rose 61 percent during the previous Iranian calendar year 1399 (ended on March 20) compared to the figure for the preceding



year. The country's aluminum ingot output stood at 446,800 tons in the previous year. Iran's major aluminum producers had managed to produce 278,318 tons of the product in the Iranian calendar year 1398. The country's aluminum ingot production in the Iranian calendar year 1398

had declined eight percent in comparison to the figure for its preceding year. IMIDRO data show that among the country's top producers, Iranian Aluminum Company (IRALCO) had the best performance in the previous year producing 185,000 tons of aluminum ingots. Aluminum ingot production in the country

reached 41,000 tons in the last month of the previous year (February 19-March 20), registering a 38 percent rise compared to the 30,000 tons in the preceding year's same period. Annual production of the aluminum ingot in the country is planned to increase 63 percent by the end of the current Iranian calendar year (March 20).

The country's aluminum ingot production in the Iranian calendar year 1398 had declined eight percent in comparison to the figure for its preceding year.

1st scientific article about 'COVIran Barekat' published

Iranian scientists have published the 1st article on the Iranian-made coronavirus vaccine, 'COVIran Barekat', at BioRxiv.

The article is titled: "Safety and Potency of COVIran Barekat Inactivated Vaccine Candidate for SARS-CoV-2: A Preclinical Study."

"There is an urgent demand to manufacture an effective and safe vaccine to prevent SARS-CoV2 infection,

which resulted in a global pandemic," the article's abstract says.

"In this study, we developed an inactivated whole-virus SARS-CoV-2 candidate vaccine named COVIran Barekat. Immunization at two different doses (3 microgram or 5 microgram per dose) elicited a high level of SARS-CoV-2 specific neutralizing antibodies in mice, rabbits, and non-human primates. The results show the safety profile in studied animals (include guinea pig, rabbit, mice, and monkeys)," it added. "Rhesus macaques were immunized with the two-dose of 5 microgram and

microgram of the COVIran Barekat vaccine and showed highly efficient protection against 104 TCID50 of SARS-CoV-2 intratracheal challenge compared with the control group. These results highlight the COVIran Barekat vaccine as a potential candidate to induce a strong and potent immune response which may be a promising and feasible vaccine to protect against SARS-CoV2 infection." Mass production of the Iranian-made anti-Coronavirus began at a pharmaceutical factory run by the Execution of Imam Khomeini Order (EIKO) in Tehran in mid-May.

Iran starts importing electricity from Azerbaijan

Spokesperson for Iranian Electricity Industry revealed that Islamic Republic of Iran began importing electricity from the Republic of Azerbaijan on Thu. in order to reduce restrictions for supplying domestic power.

According to Iran Power Generation, Transmission & Distribution Management Company (TAVANIR), Mostafa Rajabi Mashhadi went on to say that Iran's import of electricity from the Republic of Azerbaijan kicked off by synchronization of Moghan power transmission lines to the power grid of Republic of Azerbaijan. Presently, 73-MW power of the said transmission line is injected into Iran's domestic

electricity grid, he added. He went on to say that the amount of Iran's power import from the aforementioned electricity transmission line is expandable up to 130-MW in peak consumption hour. However, the power industry of the country has used all its potentials and capacities to meet domestic demands for the electricity needed in the country, Rajabi Mashhadi emphasized.

Industrial projects worth \$152m inaugurated in Kerman province

Iranian Industry, Mining and Trade Minister Alireza Razm Hosseini on Thursday inaugurated six major industrial projects with a total investment of 6.4 trillion rials (about \$152.3 million) in southern Kerman province.

The inaugurated projects include a chromite concentrate production plant, a gold concentrate plant, a copper concentrate production unit, a silica concentrate plant and a flour factory, Shata reported.

Heading a delegation, Razm Hosseini arrived in Kerman on Wednesday evening for a two-day visit.

On Thursday, the minister paid a visit to an air conditioning production unit in southern Kerman, and then he inaugurated the chromite concentrate production plant which has the capacity to produce over 15,000 tons of chromite annually. The plant was established with a total invest of 790 billion rials (about \$18.8 million) and will create job opportunities for over 100 people.

The gold concentrate plan is also going to produce 65 kilograms of gold concentrate every year and will offer direct jobs to 100 people. As for the copper concentrate unit, the plant is expected to produce 15,000 tons of the products annually. Some 3.5 trillion rials (about \$83.33 million) has been invested in this unit which is going to create jobs for 300 people. Put into operation with 500 billion rials of investment (about \$11.9 million), the flour factory has the annual capacity of 60,000 tons and provides jobs for 34 people.

Drought Inflicts Losses Worth \$2.7 Billion on Agro Sector

Drought has inflicted 670 trillion rials (\$2.79 billion) worth of losses on Iran's agriculture sector since the beginning of the current crop year.

According to Mohammad Mousavi, an official with the Agriculture Ministry, assessments carried out over 11.2 million hectares of farming lands in 30 provinces show 43% of the total losses amounting to 670 trillion rials pertained to the decline in agronomic

production, 26% to a drop in horticultural output, 13% to a fall in fisheries and livestock, and 11% to a decline in forage crops.

"In addition, 4% of the total damage were due to challenges created in water infrastructures, such as pools, pipes, qanats and springs and 3% of the losses can be attributed to water supply complications and the animal feed used by nomads," Mousavi was quoted as saying by Mehr News Agency.

Lifting of US Sanctions on Iranians Unrelated to JCPOA Talks: Spokesman

Iranian Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Saeed Khatibzadeh said there was no connection between the US' "selective" move to lift a number of Iran-related sanctions and the negotiations on the revival of the 2015 nuclear deal.

"Selective US delistings are neither related to JCPOA talks nor viewed as signals of goodwill—specially when coupled with renewed economic terrorism," the Iranian spokesperson said in a post on his Twitter account on Friday.

He also emphasized that US President Donald Trump "must abandon his 'maximum failure' by effectively and verifiably removing sanctions" on Iran "instead of following Trump's footsteps". His comments came a day after the US Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) announced in a statement that it had dropped sanctions on three former National Iranian Oil Company officials and two companies that previously "traded" Iranian petrochemicals. It said the former officials were removed from US blacklists as they were no longer affiliated with the entities already on US sanctions list.

However, the statement added that the Treasury had imposed new sanctions on several entities it said is financially helping Yemen's popular Ansarullah movement that has been defending the country against Saudi-led aggression since 2015.

Putin dismisses claims on Russia's satellite offer to Iran

Russian President Vladimir Putin has dismissed as fake news the claims that Russia was preparing to offer Iran an advanced satellite system that would enable Tehran to track potential military targets in the Middle East.

"It's just fake news. At the very least, I don't know anything about this kind of thing, those who are speaking about it probably will maybe know more about it. It's just nonsense, garbage," Putin said in an interview with NBC TV channel, TASS reported.

The Washington Post reported on Thursday citing current and the former US and Middle Eastern officials that Moscow planned to supply Iran with a Russian-made Kanopus-V satellite. The report claimed this advanced satellite system will enable Iran to survey potential military targets across the Middle East and beyond.

Deputy Spokesperson of the Department of State, Jalina Porter, told a briefing that the US administration was following these media reports.

JCPOA Joint Commission to resume in Vienna on Jun. 12

The Joint Commission of Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) in a statement announced that the 6th round of the talks for the revival of JCPOA start in the Austrian capital Vienna on Saturday, June 12. The 6th round of intensive talks for the revival of JCPOA will be resumed in Vienna on Sat. in the presence of remaining members of the agreement and the American side. The Joint Commission will be chaired, on behalf of EU High Representative Josep Borrell, by the Deputy Secretary General/Political Director of the European External Action Service, Enrique Mora. It will be attended by representatives of China, France, Germany, Russia, the United Kingdom and Iran. Participants will continue their discussions in view of a possible return of the United States to the JCPOA and on how to ensure the full and effective implementation of the JCPOA, a statement by the EU is read.

Removing sanctions, US can rejoin JCPOA: Pres. candidate

Presidential candidate Alireza Zakani says the United States can return to the 2015 nuclear deal only if it removes, verifiably, all its anti-Iranian sanctions.



In an interview with Iran's English-language Press TV and Arabic-language Al-Alam news networks, broadcast on Friday night, Zakani offered a brief outline of the foreign policy he would pursue if he won the presidential election, slated for June 18.

Zakani said Iran had fully fulfilled its commitments under the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), as the nuclear deal is formally called, and "we are now seeking to find out why Europe is not upholding its end of the bargain. That is why the negotiations are taking place." "We will continue negotiations to make our demands, and it is now Europe that should fulfill its commitments," he said.

In the case of the US, Zakani added, there is a condition that Washington must fulfill before it can rejoin the JCPOA, over three years after it withdrew from the deal under ex-President Donald Trump and went on a campaign of draconian sanctions against the Iranian nation.

"The condition for the US to return to the JCPOA is removing all the sanctions, giving [all the necessary] legal guarantees, followed by our verification. If that happens, the US can rejoin the JCPOA," he said.

Zakani referred to certain calls by the US and its allies for the inclusion of other issues unrelated to Iran's nuclear program in the JCPOA, including the Islamic Republic's conventional



missile work and its influential role in the region.

"The negotiations will solely revolve around the nuclear issue and the JCPOA, and will have nothing to do at all with the defense sector and the region," he added.

Zakani, a fierce critic of the JCPOA, said the current politicians have been suffering from "a lack of self-esteem" on the world stage, which he said poses the biggest challenge to Iran's global standing.

Zakani to pursue 'active, smart diplomacy' in global arena. He said he would work to change the approach in the foreign policy "from inaction to active, smart diplomacy," a process under which Iran's 15 neighbors would be regarded as "a serious priority," followed by the resistance axis and other Muslim countries.

Zakani said he would go for making changes to the Foreign Ministry as his "first and most serious" measure if he becomes president to enable the diplomatic apparatus to follow up on economic and cultural ties with other countries besides political interactions.

Next come the ties with the Eastern powers such as China and Russia, said Zakani,

adding that the country can pursue agreements for long-term interactions with those powers.

On relations with the West, Zakani said the 1979 Islamic Revolution has enabled Iran to end the policy of submission to the Westerners and base its relations with them on "common interests and mutual respect."

"No ties with US as long as it pursues uprooting Iran's nation"

"As long as the US pursues uprooting the Iranian nation and the Revolution, it will definitely fail to succeed, and relations with it, similar to those with other states, would be meaningless," Zakani said. The lawmaker emphasized the need for the country to "grow strong" in the face of the pressure that the United States has been exerting on the nation over the past 40 years.

"If we grow strong at home, these pressures will lose their effect," Zakani said.

On policy vis-à-vis Persian Gulf kingdoms

Zakani was also asked for his views on troubled ties between Iran and some Persian Gulf governments. He said he would pursue "de-escalation" with Iran's

southern neighbors "so we can set the stage for collective cooperation on safeguarding our interests and ensuring lasting security in the region." He criticized some of the Persian Gulf kingdoms for adopting "wrong policies" in the region, referring, as a case in point, to Saudi Arabia, which has been leading a deadly military campaign against Yemen.

"We advise Saudi Arabia to accept its mistake...and stop committing crimes against the Yemeni nation," he said.

The presidential candidate also condemned the Arab regimes which signed normalization deals with Israel and said "their biggest response was what happened in Gaza, the West Bank and the 1948 territories" last month.

"I think the [normalization] file was already closed. [The normalization] came to an end before even being born," he said.

"Those countries [that chose normalization] have definitely realized or will realize that they have made a big mistake since Israel itself is on the verge of annihilation and its disintegration process will begin from within the regime," Zakani added.



Iran Eyes New Chapter in Ties with the Philippines

Iranian President Hassan Rouhani congratulated the Philippines on its Independence Day, hoping for a new chapter in the bilateral relations between Tehran and Manila with the promotion of regional and international cooperation.

In a letter to his Filipino counterpart Rodrigo Duterte on Saturday, President Rouhani congratulated the Philippines on the anniversary of gaining independence from Spain.

Highlighting the historical background of relations between Iran and the Philippines and their potential capacities, Rouhani expressed hope that two Asian nations would enhance the bilateral, regional and international cooperation and mark a new chapter in the bilateral ties.

He also wished the Philippines prosperity and success.

Iran and the Philippines started bilateral relations in 1974.

In recent years, the two governments have ramped up efforts to enhance the political, economic and cultural ties.

Venezuela calls on US to 'unlock' vaccine money

Venezuela's President Nicolas Maduro demanded on Friday that US President Joe Biden "unlock the money for the vaccines" for the COVID-19, coronavirus.

Maduro's statement came one day after his administration denounced the "blocking" of \$10 million that was transferred from Venezuela to COVAX—a system of the World Health Organization created to provide coronavirus vaccines to developing countries.

"I demand today, June 11, from Venezuela, that the government of Joe Biden cease its blocking of money from Venezuela for COVAX vaccines, that the government of Joe Biden unlocks the money of vaccines for the people of Venezuela," Maduro said in a television address, Anadolu reported.

Foreign Minister Jorge Arreaza released a letter Thursday on Twitter that was sent by COVAX to his government.

It details that Swiss Bank UBS froze \$10 million transferred from Venezuela to COVAX.

The letter said \$110 million was transferred successfully, meaning the majority of the vaccines purchased should be sent to Venezuela.

Venezuela agreed with COVAX to purchase 11 million doses for \$120 million.

Accordingly, the \$110 million deposited by Venezuela should be enough for about 10 million doses.

Maduro said that COVAX had "enough money" to "immediately" start sending vaccines.

"The COVAX system has no excuses for not sending the vaccines to Venezuela," said Maduro.

Putin Calls Biden 'Career Man,' Hopes There Won't Be Any Impulse-Based Movements

US President Joe Biden is a career politician and there is hope that there will not be any impulse-based movements, Russian President Vladimir Putin said in an interview with NBC TV channel.

The Russian leader noted that Biden "is radically different from Trump because President Biden is a career man. He has spent virtually his entire adulthood in politics."

"That's a different kind of person, and it is my great hope that yes, there are some advantages, some disadvantages, but there will not be any impulse-based movements, on behalf of the sitting US president," Putin said, TASS reported.

Russian President said that he does not worry about Biden's scandalous remarks on him.

"I always guided by the interests of Russian people and Russian state. And some kind of labels - it's not something

I worry about in the least," Putin said answering a question on his reaction to Biden's interview, where he called him "a killer."

"Over my tenure, I've gotten used to attacks from all kinds of angles and from all kinds of areas under all kinds of pretext, and reasons and of different caliber and fierceness and none of it surprises me," Putin said.

According to Putin, using such labels has become normal for US political culture, probably under Hollywood's influence, but this does not seem normal in Russia. "Look, you know, I don't want to come across as being rude, but this looks like some kind of indigestion except that it's verbal indigestion," the Russian leader said after NBC's Keir Simmons mentioned by name some individuals who have been killed in recent years. "You've mentioned many individuals who indeed suffered and perished at different



points in time for various reasons, at the hands of different individuals," he said. The full version of the interview will be aired on Monday. Biden gave a notorious interview with ABC in March, which caused a public outcry. The US leader said that Moscow would have to "pay a price" for its allegedly meddling in America's elections and agreed when asked if Russian President Vladimir Putin was a 'killer'.

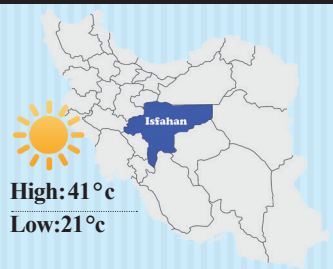

MAHAK supports 17,358 blood-cancer children over past 30 yrs.

MAHAK Charity Center has supported 17,358 children with the blood cancer during the past 30 years since its establishment.

According to World Health Organization (WHO), Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia (ALL) which is also known as blood cancer is one of the most common cancers in children and if diagnosed early, its cure rate will increase significantly. As more people in the society become aware of the symptoms of this disease, its detection will be on right time and accordingly, the treatment will be more effective, less costly and less painful. On the occasion of International Week for Children with Leukemia, we had an interview with the Medical Deputy of MAHAK regarding the symptoms and information related to this disease.

Dr. Alireza Daneshgar addressed the child-related groups that they should pay attention to the signs and symptoms of this disease as the most important step in its diagnosis. He said: "Paleness, weakness, lethargy, frequent infections, fever, easy bruising, bleeding that is hard to stop, and pain in the bones and joints are the symptoms which are seen in children with leukemia. It should be noted that these symptoms do not necessarily mean that a child has cancer; however, the parents should refer to

a physician as soon as they notice any of them. Regarding the importance of periodic check-ups and tests for children, he added: "according to the child's age, the time intervals between check-ups are different. New born and infants should be checked once a month during their first year of life; and it will be reduced to every two months in the second year and every three months in the third year. After that, check-ups should be done once or twice in year. It should be noted that diagnostic tests have no specific time and it will be done based on physician's prescription."

He mentioned the other common cancers in children which are Wilm's tumors, Retinoblastoma, Low-grade Glioma, Hodgkin Lymphoma, Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma and added: "The importance of these check-ups and tests becomes even greater when we know that sometimes cancer affects the body asymptotically so, it is only diagnosable through routine check-ups and medical examinations or with the disease progression." On the subject of heredity of blood cancer in children and as a conclusion, Dr. Daneshgari said, "if family members are challenging with variety of cancers, children are more likely to get cancer; however, there are currently no accurate diagnostic tests to predict it. Besides genetic factors and family roots, malnutrition, unhealthy drinking water and polluted air can all contribute to cancer in children. So, it is more important to adhere to periodic check-ups if there is a family history of cancer."

Iran Regains Right to Vote at UN

Iran's ambassador to the United Nations said the country has regained its voting rights in the UN General Assembly after paying its dues in arrears to the UN, lashing out at the US for keeping the sanctions that have frozen Tehran's foreign assets. "Illegal US sanctions have not just deprived our people of medicine; they have also prevented Iran from paying

our dues in arrears to the UN," Majid Takht Ravanchi announced on his Twitter account on Friday. "After more than 6 months of working on it, the UN today announced it has received the funds," the envoy noted. "ALL inhumane sanctions must be lifted NOW," Takht Ravanchi emphasized. UN deputy spokesman Farhan Haq announced on Friday that Iran had paid the minimum amount — \$16,251,298 — and was able to vote in

Friday's election for five new members of the UN Security Council. He thanked banking and government authorities in various places, including South Korea, for enabling the payment to be made.

Iran lost its voting rights in January and Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said in a letter circulated June 2 that Tehran had still not paid the minimum and would continue being unable to vote, along with Central African Republic, AP reported.

Mossad admits assassinating Fakhrizadeh, sabotage at Natanz

Iran's ambassador to the United Nations said the country has regained its voting rights in the UN General Assembly after paying its dues in arrears to the UN, lashing out at the US for keeping the sanctions that have frozen Tehran's foreign assets.

The outgoing head of Israel's Mossad spy agency has given the most direct acknowledgement that the Tel Aviv regime was behind the recent sabotage attacks on Iran's nuclear enrichment facility at Natanz and assassinating nuclear scientist Mohsen Fakhrizadeh.

Yossi Cohen's statements to Israel's Channel 12 investigative program "Uvda" aired on Thursday night provided an extraordinary debriefing by the head of the traditionally secretive agency in what appears to be Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's final days in office.

It also sent a clear message to other nuclear experts in Iran's nuclear program that they, too, might become targets for assassination, even as diplomats in Vienna are negotiating hard to rescue the 2015 nuclear agreement, officially called the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA).

Cohen did not outright claim responsibility for the strikes, but his specificity was the closest confirmation yet of Israeli involvement. The interviewer, journalist Ilan Dayan, also appeared to provide a comprehensive explanation of how Israel sneaked the bombs into the Natanz nuclear site's underground passageways, which Cohen did not contest.

When asked about sabotage in the Natanz facility, the interviewer asked Cohen where he'd take them if they could go there, and he said, "to the cellar," where "the centrifuges used to spin."

"It doesn't look like it used to look," he added. As a signatory to the nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT), Iran has been insisting that its nuclear program is peaceful. Before Iran's recent measures to

limit cooperation with the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) in retaliation for the violation of the JCPOA by the U.S. and imposition of sanctions, the UN nuclear watchdog issue a report that Iran's nuclear activities were subject to the most intensive inspections in the history of the UN body.

While Cohen did not claim assassination on record, Dayan describes Cohen as having "personally signed off on the entire effort" in the program.

Iran has repeatedly expressed its disdain with Israel's attacks, with Iran's ambassador to the IAEA, Kazem Gharibabadi, warning on Thursday that the incidents "not only will be responded decisively, but will also certainly leave no option for Iran but to reconsider its transparency measures and cooperation policy."

During the Vienna talks, the U.S. has demanded that Iran "destroy" the advanced centrifuges it started to spin at the Fordow and Natanz facilities one year after the U.S. withdrawal from the JCPOA. These centrifuges, known as the IR9, are 50 times more powerful at producing uranium than the ones covered by the JCPOA, according to Reuters.

Iran has flatly rejected the U.S. demand just as Washington is refusing to lift all the sanctions imposed, re-imposed, or relabeled by the Trump administration against Iran.

The incumbent U.S. administration seems to follow Israel's hawkish policies toward Iran, distancing itself from the slogans made earlier to revive the nuclear deal.

Ex-Mossad chief's acknowledgement coupled with the stubbornness of the U.S. on its irrational demands may prove that United States is an accomplice in Israel's assassination of Fakhrizadeh.
